Discover God's Call offers laity opportunity to discern Direction

A retreat is scheduled for Nov. 12-14 at the Durr-Wise Conference Center, Wesley Pines in Gallman. The Rev. Scott Carter will be the keynote speaker. Cost is \$140 and the registration deadline is Oct. 1, 2004.
