### A Message from our Chapter President

We of the MS DGC Chapter have been blessed with two successful retreats in the past year, our first church retreat at Batesville UMC, and our fall retreat at Camp Wesley Pines, a total of approximately 40 new Discoverers were led to have confirmed calls for the use of their spiritual gifts.

The meeting of the National DGC Council was held in Florida, in conjunction with the reestablishing of a Florida Chapter by having a retreat that had 25 new Discoverers. The major emphasis from the National level is now the movement away from the Foundation for Evangelism to being a stand alone Non-profit Charitable Organization, to become a part of the Global Board of Discipleship. Members of the Council are working on various phases of this project as assigned by the National Executive Committee. It is believed that this status will be a great advantage to the continuation of the DGC vision.

Please continue to lift up our DGC ministry in your prayers, so that we will continue to be blessed with this opportunity to serve God.



## Our Speaker for the Johnston Chapel Retreat –

Rev. Dale Hathorn

Dale is the son of a Methodist minister and a native of Houston, MS. He played basketball in high school and attended Mississippi State

University on a basketball scholarship from 1972 - 1976. While in college he worked in music evangelism and recorded an inspirational music album. After graduating in 1976 with a B.A. in Vocal Music, Dale continued to serve in churches as a personal/cell pastor, worship leader, and small group leader. He also worked in the school system as a biology teacher.

In 1988 Dale was called into ordained ministry and graduated from Memphis Theological Seminary in 1991. Rev. Hathorn served in pastoral ministry from 1988 until 2003. That year he launched a full time ministry in evangelism, renewal, and mission. Since then he has led evangelistic crusades to Mexico, Ukraine, Ghana, and Nigeria.

Rev, Hathorn is a General Evangelist for the UMC and Member and Vice President of the National Association of United Methodist Evangelists. In his spare time he likes to work in the Community Theater and show Pointers and Cocker Spaniels.

Rev. Hathorn and wife, Jean, have three children. They reside in Nettleton, MS.
